AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE BY THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION OF A SWIMMING POOL AND ARTIFICIAL ICE SKATING RINK IN THE CITY OF NEWTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The metropolitan district commission is hereby authorized and
2 directed to construct, and thereafter to maintain a recreation
3 center consisting of an outdoor swimming pool and an artificial
4 ice skating rink in the city of Newton. For said purposes, said
5 commission may expend such sums as may be appropriated
6 therefor.

In the Senate Chamber at Boston, this 15th day of July, 1880.

At the request of the Honorable the Governor and Council, the following Resolutions were adopted by the Senate, to-wit:

3. That the Honorable the Governor and Council be authorized to employ a commission of three persons to inquire into the condition of the State Lunatic Asylum, and to report thereon to the Senate at the next session of the Legislature.
4. That the Honorable the Governor and Council be authorized to employ a commission of three persons to inquire into the condition of the State Normal School, and to report thereon to the Senate at the next session of the Legislature.
