RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE PRESERVATION AND CARE OF RARE AND OLD BOOKS, AND LETTERS AND DOCUMENTS OF HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE LOCATED IN THE GEORGE FINGOLD STATE LIBRARY.

1 *Resolved*, That an unpaid special commission, to consist of one
2 member of the senate, two members of the house of representa-
3 tives, the state librarian, and two persons to be appointed by
4 the governor, is hereby established for the purpose of making
5 an investigation and study relative to the preservation and care
6 of rare and old books, and letters and documents of historical
7 significance located in the George Fingold State Library.
