AN ACT REGULATING THE METHOD OF COMPUTING INTEREST TO BE CHARGED ON THE FINANCING OF SALES OF MOTOR VEHICLES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 14 of chapter 255B of the General Laws, as appearing
2 in section 1 of chapter 674 of the acts of 1958, is hereby amended
3 by adding at the end thereof the following sentence: — Interest
4 shall be computed and charged only upon the unpaid balance.

1. The Commission on the Administration of the State was organized on July 1, 1906, by the passage of Chapter 100 of the Laws of 1906, which provided for the appointment of a commission to study the administration of the State and to report thereon to the Governor and the Legislature.

2. The Commission was organized on July 1, 1906, and held its first meeting on July 10, 1906, at Albany. It has since that time held numerous meetings and has conducted extensive research into the various departments of the State.

3. The Commission has the honor to submit to the Governor and the Legislature this report on the results of its work during the past year.
