AN ACT MAKING IT A CRIMINAL OFFENCE FOR ANY PERSON UNDER TWENTY-ONE YEARS OF AGE TO CARRY OR HAVE IN HIS POSSESSION AND CONTROL UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES ANY ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 138 of the General Laws is hereby amended by insert-
- 2 ing after section 34A the following section: —
- 3 *Section 34B.* Any person under twenty-one years of age who
- 4 has on his person or within his possession or control in a public
- 5 place or in any automobile or boat operated by him, any alco-
- 6 holic beverage shall be punished by a fine of not more than fifty
- 7 dollars and, if such person was operating a motor vehicle in
- 8 which such beverage was being transported, the court shall
- 9 notify the registrar of motor vehicles, who shall suspend, for a
- 10 period of not less than one month nor more than three months,
- 11 the license of such person to operate a motor vehicle.
