## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AN ACT REQUIRING THE STATE LIBRARY TO MAKE RECORDINGS OF ALL TESTIMONY GIVEN BEFORE ANY COMMITTEE OF THE GENERAL COURT.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 The state library is hereby authorized and directed to record  
2 by the use of tape recorders the testimony of all persons who  
3 appear at any hearing of a committee of the general court. The  
4 said library shall have custody of the tape recorders and the  
5 recordings made therewith. For these purposes the sum of ten  
6 thousand dollars is hereby appropriated.
