## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Three.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF BOSTON TO CONTRACT TO EXTINGUISH FIRES ON TAX EXEMPT PROPERTY OF THE MASSACHUSETTS PORT AUTHORITY IN SAID CITY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 The city of Boston acting by its fire commissioner with the  
2 approval of its mayor and the Massachusetts Port Authority  
3 acting by a majority of its members are hereby respectively au-  
4 thorized to make contracts from time to time whereby for such  
5 annual fee as said city and authority shall mutually agree the  
6 city will provide municipal fire service for the tax exempt prop-  
7 erty of said authority in said city.
