AN ACT INCREASING THE PENALTIES FOR SETTING UP OR PROMOTING
A LOTTERY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 271 of the General Laws is hereby amended by strik-
2 ing out section 7, as appearing in the Tercentenary Edition,
3 and inserting in place thereof the following section: —

4 *Section 7.* Whoever sets up or promotes a lottery for money or
5 other property of value, or by way of lottery disposes of any
6 property of value, or under the pretext of a sale, gift or delivery
7 of other property or of any right, privilege or thing whatever
8 disposes of or offers or attempts to dispose of any property, with
9 intent to make the disposal thereof dependent upon or connected
10 with chance by lot, dice, numbers, game, hazard or other gam-
11 bling device, whereby such chance or device is made an addi-
12 tional inducement to the disposal or sale of said property, and
13 whoever aids either by printing or writing, or is in any way con-
14 cerned, in the setting up, managing or drawing of such lottery,
15 or in such disposal or offer or attempt to dispose of property by
16 such chance or device, shall be punished by a fine of not more
17 than ten thousand dollars or by imprisonment in a state's
18 prison for not more than three years, or in jail for not more than
19 two and one half years, or in a house of correction for not more
20 than two and one half years.
