AN ACT PERMITTING DANCING ON SUNDAY IN CONNECTION WITH THE PERFORMANCE OF RELIGIOUS RITUALS, AT WEDDINGS, WEDDING RECEPTIONS AND CELEBRATIONS OF RELIGIOUS CUSTOMS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 4 of chapter 136 of the General Laws, as appearing in
2 section 2 of chapter 616 of the acts of 1962, is hereby amended
3 by inserting at the end thereof the following paragraph:—

4 (8) The said sections two and three and this section shall not
5 apply to dancing in connection with the performance of a re-
6 ligious ritual, at a wedding, wedding reception or celebration
7 of a religious custom.
