PROPOSAL FOR A LEGISLATIVE AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION TO PROVIDE FOR ANNULMENT OF THE RESTRICTION ON THE USE OF REVENUE FROM MOTOR VEHICLE FEES, DUTIES, EXCISES OR LICENSE TAXES.

1 A majority of all the members elected to the Senate and House  
2 of Representatives, in joint session, hereby declares it to be ex-  
3 peditent to alter the Constitution by the adoption of the follow-  
4 ing Article of Amendment, to the end that it may become a  
5 part of the Constitution [if similarly agreed to in a joint session  
6 of the next General Court and approved by the people at the  
7 state election next following]:

8 ARTICLE OF AMENDMENT.

9 ARTICLE . . . Article LXXVIII of the Amendments to  
10 the Constitution restricting the use of revenue from fees, duties,  
11 excises or license taxes relating to registration, operation or use  
12 of vehicles on public highways, or to fuels used for propelling  
13 such vehicles, to the cost of administration of laws providing for  
14 such revenue, to refunds and adjustments in relation thereto,  
15 to payment of highway obligations or cost of construction, re-  
16 construction, maintenance and repair of public highways and  
17 to the enforcement of state traffic laws is hereby annulled.
