AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE BOARD OF REGISTRATION IN VETERINARY MEDICINE TO ISSUE A LICENSE TO CERTAIN VETERINARIANS LICENSED IN OTHER STATES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 112 of the General Laws is hereby amended by in-
2 serting after section 56, the following section:—
3 *Section 56A.* The board of registration in veterinary medi-
4 cine may, upon a satisfactory practical examination demon-
5 strating proficiency and without further theoretical examina-
6 tion, issue a license to any reputable veterinarian of good moral
7 character who has been in lawful practice for five consecutive
8 years or more next preceding the filing of his application in
9 some other state or territory having requirements for admission
10 determined by the board to be at least equal to the requirements
11 of this state, and who is desirous of removing to this state, upon
12 certificate from the board of examiners or like board of the state
13 or territory in which such veterinarian was a practitioner certi-
14 fying to his competency and that he is a veterinarian of good
15 moral character and professional attainment and upon the pay-
16 ment of a fee of seventy-five dollars to said board; provided the
17 state or territory issuing the certificate herein required to such
18 applicant extends a like privilege to engage in the practice of
19 veterinary medicine within its own borders to veterinarians reg-
20 istered and licensed by this state and removing to such other
21 state or territory and provided any veterinarian who has been
22 a member of the armed forces shall be granted credit for the
23 period of such service in computing such five year period.
