## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Three.

### AN ACT PROVIDING FOR STERILIZATION OF CERTAIN BEDDING AND REGULATING THE PAYMENT OF CERTAIN LICENSE FEES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 273 of chapter 94 of the General Laws is  
2 hereby amended by striking out the ninth paragraph, as appear-  
3 ing in section 2 of chapter 611 of the acts of 1959, and inserting  
4 in place thereof the following paragraph:—

5 All secondhand mattresses, box springs and sleeping pillows,  
6 if intended for resale, shall be sterilized as required by sections  
7 two hundred and seventy to two hundred and seventy-six,  
8 inclusive.

1 SECTION 2. Section 275 of said chapter 94, as so appearing, is  
2 hereby amended by adding at the end the following paragraph:—

3 An application for an original license, received on or after  
4 January first, shall be accompanied by a fee of one half of the  
5 required license fee. This paragraph shall not apply to the steri-  
6 lization license, which expires one year from the date of issue.
