By Mr. Bevilacqua of Haverhill, petition of Joseph L. Willett (mayor) that the city of Haverhill be authorized to vote at its municipal election in the current year on the question of adopting the Plan A form of city government. Cities.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF HAVERHILL TO VOTE AT ITS MUNICIPAL ELECTION IN THE CURRENT YEAR ON THE QUESTION OF ADOPTING THE "PLAN A" FORM OF CITY GOVERNMENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of chapter forty-three of the
2 General Laws, the following question shall be placed upon the
3 official ballot to be used at the municipal election for the city of
4 Haverhill in the current year:— "Shall the city of Haverhill
5 adopt the form of government defined as Plan A and consisting
6 of government by a mayor and councillors elected at large with
7 elections to be held biennially in every odd-numbered year ac-
8 cording to chapter forty-three of the General Laws relative to
9 city charters?"

10 If a majority of the voters voting on said question vote in the
11 affirmative, the officers provided for under said Plan A shall be
12 elected in accordance with the provisions of chapter forty-three
13 of the General Laws relating to such plan and in accordance with
14 section fifteen thereof and their terms of office shall begin at ten
15 o'clock in the forenoon of the first Monday of January following
16 their election, at which time said Plan A shall take full effect in
17 said city.
