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HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, May 20, 1963.

The committee on Ways and Means, to whom were referred the Bill directing the Metropolitan District Commission to extend the sea wall at Revere Beach in the city of Revere (Senate, No. 47); the Bill directing the Metropolitan District Commission to construct a solarium in the bathhouse being constructed at Revere Beach in the city of Revere (Senate, No. 433, amended); the Bill authorizing and directing the Metropolitan District Commission to complete the wall at Revere Beach in the city of Revere (House, No. 288); the Bill providing for the construction and maintenance by the Metropolitan District Commission of a swimming pool and artificial ice skating rink in the city of Newton (House, No. 724); the Bill authorizing the Metropolitan District Commission to construct groins the length of Revere Beach in the city of Revere (House, No. 999); the Bill providing for the construction and maintenance by the Metropolitan District Commission of recreational facilities within the Washington Park urban renewal area of the Roxbury district of the city of Boston (House, No. 1267); the Resolve providing for an investigation and study by the Metropolitan District Commission relative to the acquiring of certain park land in the city of Newton for the purpose of providing a recreational area (House, No. 1991); the Bill directing the Metropolitan District Commission to expend one quarter of one per cent of certain appropriations for the purpose of maintaining and making certain capital improvements to the Bunker Hill Monument (House, No. 2001, changed); the Resolve providing for an investigation and study by the Metropolitan District Commission relative to the feasibility of acquiring the old Pine Street dump in the city of Newton and developing the same for recreational purposes (House, No. 2505); the Bill authorizing the Metropolitan District Commission to take over the care, control and maintenance of Chestnut Hill Avenue and Saint Thomas More Road in the Brighton district

of the city of Boston (House, No. 2772); the Bill authorizing and directing the Metropolitan District Commission to assume control of certain land and construct recreational facilities thereon in the Roxbury district of the city of Boston (House, No. 3152); the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1004) of John T. Tynan that the Metropolitan District Commission be authorized to erect an aquarium in the Castle Island section of South Boston); and the report of the Legislative Research Council (under an order adopted by the House on July 9, 1962 and by the Senate on July 10, 1962) relative to providing for the construction and maintenance by the Metropolitan District Commission of a sea aquarium in the Castle Island section of the city of Boston (Senate, No. 700), report the accompanying Resolve (House, No. 3470).

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Three

RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION RELATIVE TO PROVIDING RECREATIONAL FACILITIES AND SHORE PROJECTS UNDER ITS JURISDICTION.

1 *Resolved*, That the metropolitan district commission is hereby  
2 authorized and directed to make an investigation and study of  
3 the subject matter of current senate documents numbered 47,  
4 directing the metropolitan district commission to extend the  
5 sea wall at Revere beach in the city of Revere; 433, directing  
6 the metropolitan district commission to construct a solarium in  
7 the bathhouse being constructed at Revere beach in the city of  
8 Revere; 700, report of the legislative research council (under  
9 an order adopted by the House on July 9, 1962 and by the Sen-  
10 ate on July 10, 1962) relative to providing for the construction  
11 and maintenance by the metropolitan district commission of a  
12 sea aquarium in the Castle Island section of the city of Boston;  
13 and of current house documents numbered 288, authorizing and  
14 directing the metropolitan district commission to complete the  
15 wall at Revere beach in the city of Revere; 724, providing for  
16 the construction and maintenance by the metropolitan district  
17 commission of a swimming pool and artificial ice skating rink  
18 in the city of Newton; 999, authorizing the metropolitan dis-  
19 trict commission to construct groins the length of Revere beach  
20 in the city of Revere; 1004, authorizing and directing the met-  
21 ropolitan district commission to construct and maintain a sea  
22 aquarium in the Castle Island section of the city of Boston; 1267,  
23 providing for the construction and maintenance by the metropoli-  
24 tan district commission of recreational facilities within the Wash-  
25 ington Park urban renewal area of the Roxbury district of the  
26 city of Boston; 1991, providing for an investigation and study  
27 by the metropolitan district commission relative to the acquir-  
28 ing of certain park land in the city of Newton for the purpose  
29 of providing a recreational area; 2001, directing the metropoli-  
30 tan district commission to expend one quarter of one per cent

31 of certain appropriations for the purpose of maintaining and  
32 making certain capital improvements to the Bunker Hill Monu-  
33 ment; 2505, providing for an investigation and study by the  
34 metropolitan district commission relative to the feasibility of  
35 acquiring the old Pine Street dump in the city of Newton and  
36 developing the same for recreational purposes; 2772, author-  
37 izing and directing the metropolitan district commission to take  
38 over the care, control and maintenance of Chestnut Hill avenue  
39 and Saint Thomas More road in the Brighton district of the city  
40 of Boston; and 3152, authorizing and directing the metropoli-  
41 tan district commission to assume control of certain land and  
42 construct recreational facilities thereon in the Roxbury district  
43 of the city of Boston. Said commission shall report to the gen-  
44 eral court the results of its investigation and study, and its  
45 recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation nec-  
46 essary to carry such recommendations into effect, by filing the  
47 same with the clerk of the house of representatives from time  
48 to time, but not later than the last Tuesday of December in the  
49 current year.
