AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE EXEMPTION OF EARNED INCOME BY RECIPIENTS OF OLD AGE ASSISTANCE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The first paragraph of section 1 of chapter 118A of the General
2 Laws is amended by striking out the last sentence and inserting
3 in place thereof the following sentence:— In computing the
4 aforesaid minima the local board of public welfare, or the de-
5 partment acting on cases appealed, as the case may be, shall, in
6 accordance with rules and regulations made by the department,
7 deduct therefrom the amount of income the person assisted or
8 to be assisted may be receiving from any source whatsoever,
9 and may so deduct therefrom such reasonable amount as may
10 be deemed to represent the financial value of board, lodging or
11 other assistance which is being furnished to such person from
12 any source whatever, except where income is received from
13 children living with the aged parent or parents, in payment of
14 board and lodging to the amount set forth in clause 2 of section
15 two A; provided, however, that any exemption now or herein-
16 after permissible under the Federal Social Security Act relative
17 to earned income may be allowed.
