AN ACT DESIGNATING AN OVERPASS ON ROUTE 3 IN THE TOWN OF MILTON AS THE SERGEANT GEORGE F. BERTRAM MEMORIAL OVERPASS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The overpass in the town of Milton on Squantum street, over
2 state highway Route 3, is hereby designated as the Sergeant
3 George F. Bertram Memorial Overpass in honor of Sergeant
4 George F. Bertram who, as a member of the Armed Forces of
5 the United States, was killed in action in World War II. The
6 department of public works is hereby authorized and directed
7 to place thereon in a conspicuous place a tablet bearing such
8 designation.
