

By Mr. Harmon of Boston, petition of Samuel Harmon that classifications of risks and premium charges under the compulsory motor vehicle liability insurance law be uniform throughout the Commonwealth. Insurance.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT CLASSIFICATIONS OF RISKS AND PREMIUM CHARGES UNDER THE COMPULSORY MOTOR VEHICLE LIABILITY INSURANCE LAW BE UNIFORM THROUGHOUT THE COMMONWEALTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 113B of chapter 175 of the General Laws,
2 as amended, is hereby further amended by striking out the first
3 sentence of the second paragraph, as appearing in section 4 of
4 chapter 459 of the acts of 1935, and inserting in place thereof the
5 following sentence: — The commissioner shall, annually on or
6 before September fifteenth, after due hearing and investigation,
7 fix and establish **fair and reasonable classifications of risks,**
8 **and** adequate, just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory premium
9 charges to be used and charged by companies in connection with
10 the issue or execution of **motor vehicle** liability policies or bonds,
11 **both as defined in section thirty-four A of chapter ninety,**
12 for the ensuing calendar year or any part thereof. **But said**
13 **classifications and premium charges shall be uniform**
14 **throughout the commonwealth and shall not be fixed or**
15 **established according to districts or zones.**

1 SECTION 2. The state secretary shall cause to be placed on the
2 official ballot to be used at the next biennial state election the
3 following question: — Do you approve of an act passed by the
4 general court in the current year which provides that classifica-
5 tion of risks and premium charges under the com-
6 pulsory motor vehicle insurance law be uniform
7 throughout the commonwealth?

8 If the majority of votes cast in answer to said question is in
9 the affirmative, this act shall take effect, but not otherwise.
