AN ACT RELATIVE TO SEPARATE TAX BILLS FOR SCHOOL EXPENSES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 3A of chapter 60 of the General Laws, as most recently
2 amended by section 3 of chapter 444 of the acts of 1954, is hereby
3 further amended by adding at the end the following: — Any city
4 which accepts this act by vote of its council, or town by vote of
5 its town meeting, may issue separate bills for the school tax rate
6 and the general tax rate in lieu of printing on the tax bill as herein
7 provided the school tax rate and the general tax rate; said sepa-
8 rate bills shall show the net cost of schools for the tax year and
9 the net cost of general government apart from schools. The di-
10 vision of the combined tax as it appears on the said separate bills
11 shall be subject to the approval of the commission of corporations
12 and taxation.
