AN ACT RELATIVE TO STAY OF JUDGMENT AND EXECUTION IN ACTIONS OF SUMMARY PROCESS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 239 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by adding at the end the following section:—
3 *Section 14.* A stay or successive stays of judgment and exe-
4 cution may be granted under sections nine to thirteen, inclusive,
5 for a period not exceeding nine months or for periods not ex-
6 ceeding nine months in the aggregate; provided, however, that
7 a stay of judgment and execution in the case of premises occu-
8 pied by an employee of a farmer conditioned upon his employ-
9 ment by such farmer and which employment has been legally
10 terminated, shall not be granted for a longer period than two
11 months in the aggregate.

1 SECTION 2. Chapter forty-three of the acts of nineteen hun-
2 dred and forty-six is hereby repealed.
