## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Five.

### RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY OF THE ENFORCEMENT OF REGULATIONS ESTABLISHING THE FITNESS FOR HUMAN HABITATION OF CERTAIN DWELLINGS.

1 *Resolved*, That an unpaid special commission, to consist of  
2 two members of the senate, three members of the house of repre-  
3 sentatives, and four persons appointed by the governor, is hereby  
4 established for the purpose of making an investigation and study  
5 of the enforcement of regulations of cities and towns in estab-  
6 lishing standards of fitness for human habitation of dwellings  
7 of four or more units and such other matters as may be directly  
8 related thereto.

9 Said commission shall report to the general court the results  
10 of its investigation and study and its recommendations, if any,  
11 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such recom-  
12 mendations into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of the  
13 house of representatives from time to time, and by filing its final  
14 report on or before the thirtieth of April, nineteen hundred and  
15 sixty-five.
