AN ACT REVISING STATUTORY COMPENSATION FOR THE MEMBERS
OF THE PERSONNEL APPEALS BOARD.

1 *Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would tend to
2 defeat its purpose, which is to provide without delay additional
3 compensation for the members of the personnel appeals board,
4 therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary
5 for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General
Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 55 of chapter 30 of the General Laws, as most recently
2 amended by section 70 of chapter 801 of the acts of 1963, is
3 hereby further amended by striking out the first sentence and
4 inserting in place thereof the following sentence: — The chairman
5 of the board shall receive compensation at the rate of forty-five
6 dollars per day for each day of service, and the other members
7 shall receive compensation at the rate of thirty-seven dollars
8 and fifty cents per day for each day of service, but in any fiscal
9 year not more than forty-six hundred and eighty dollars shall be
10 paid to the chairman, and not more than thirty-nine hundred
11 dollars shall be paid to any other member.
