The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR A THIRD ASSISTANT CLERK IN THE SECOND DISTRICT COURT OF BRISTOL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Third assistant clerks with salaries payable by the county
2 may be appointed in the municipal court of the Roxbury district,
3 the municipal court of the Dorchester district, the municipal
4 court of the West Roxbury district and, subject to the approval
5 of the county commissioners, in the second district court of
6 Bristol, the first district court of eastern Middlesex, the district
7 court of Springfield, the third district court of eastern Middlesex,
8 the district court of East Norfolk and the central district court
9 of Worcester.

The Constitution of the State

As amended by the People of the State of New York

Article I. The Legislature shall consist of a Senate and an Assembly.

Section 1. The Senate shall be composed of twenty-four members, to be elected by the electors of the State.

Section 2. The Assembly shall be composed of fifty-five members, to be elected by the electors of the State.

Section 3. The members of the Senate shall hold office for two years, and shall be eligible for re-election.

Section 4. The members of the Assembly shall hold office for two years, and shall be eligible for re-election.

Section 5. The members of the Legislature shall be elected on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November.
