AN ACT RELATING TO THE HIGHWAY IN THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE, KNOWN AS MEMORIAL DRIVE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The highway, known as Memorial drive, extend-
2 ing along the Charles river in the city of Cambridge and under
3 the control of the metropolitan district commission, starting at
4 the Massachusetts avenue underpass, and extending westerly
5 and northerly to the River Street bridge and Memorial drive,
6 shall be constructed as a dual highway, with adequate trees,
7 plants and other attractive landscaping. For the purpose of
8 this act, said commission may expend such sums as may be
9 appropriated.

1 SECTION 2. Chapter four hundred and sixty-five of the acts
2 of nineteen hundred and forty-eight is hereby repealed.
