AN ACT RELATIVE TO PROVIDING RELIEF AND ASSISTANCE TO PERSONS FORCED TO RELOCATE BY REASON OF THE EXERCISE OF EMINENT DOMAIN BY URBAN REDEVELOPMENT AUTHORITIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, all
2 cities and towns engaging in urban redevelopment programs shall
3 reimburse any person who is required to relocate, and who does
4 in fact relocate himself, in the full amount of all expenses in-
5 curred, but in any event the minimum amount to be paid by
6 such person shall be one thousand dollars plus a reasonable
7 finder's fee. All monies to be used for such purposes shall be
8 raised through the issuing of tax exempt municipal bonds.
