AN ACT ALLOWING CERTAIN MUNICIPAL POLICE OFFICERS TO LIVE
OUTSIDE THE CITY OR TOWN IN WHICH THEY ARE EMPLOYED.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:*

1 Chapter 41 of the General Laws is hereby amended by in-
2 serting after section 99 the following section:—

3 *Section 99A.* In any city or town which accepts this sec-
4 tion, the members of the regular police department of said
5 city or town who have been members of said department for
6 at least five years may reside outside said city or town; pro-
7 vided, they reside within the commonwealth and within fifteen
8 miles of the limits of said city or town.
