AN ACT GRANTING AN EXCISE EXEMPTION TO ERNEST CASTRO, A PARAPLEGIC VETERAN.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of section one of chapter
2 sixty A of the General Laws, motor vehicles of Ernest J. Cas-
3 tro of Moss Hill road in the town of Russell, a paraplegic
4 veteran, shall be exempt from payment of an excise tax.

The Constitution of the United States

As amended by the Thirteenth, Fourteenth, Fifteenth, and Nineteenth Amendments

As passed by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States in Congress assembled

WASHINGTON: 1875

It is enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States in Congress assembled, That the Constitution of the United States be printed in the following form:

I. We the People of the United States, in Order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defence, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do hereby ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America.
