AN ACT EXTENDING THE EXEMPTION OF EXCISE TAX ON MOTOR VEHICLES OF CERTAIN VETERANS AND PERSONS WHO HAVE SUFFERED LOSS OF OR LOSS OF USE OF BOTH LEGS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The fifth paragraph of section 1 of chapter 60A  
2 of the General Laws, as appearing in section 1 of chapter 273 of  
3 the acts of 1959, is hereby amended by striking out, in line 2,  
4 the word "operated".

1 SECTION 2. The sixth paragraph of said section 1 of said  
2 chapter 60A, as inserted by chapter 644 of the acts of 1962, is  
3 hereby amended by striking out, in line 2, the word "operated".
