AN ACT RESTRICTING ADMISSIONS TO STATE COLLEGES AND THE UNIVERSITY OF MASSACHUSETTS TO RESIDENTS OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 No person shall be admitted as a student to any state college
- 2 named in section one of chapter seventy-three of the General
- 3 Laws, or to the University of Massachusetts, unless he has re-
- 4 sided in Massachusetts for one year immediately prior to filing
- 5 application for admission to such institution.
