RESOLUTIONS MEMORIALIZING CONGRESS TO DRAFT APPROPRIATE RESOLUTIONS OF CONDOLENCE IN MEMORY OF SIR WINSTON CHURCHILL.

1 *Whereas*, It was with great sorrow that the people of the
2 United States learned of the death of Sir Winston Churchill;
3 and

4 *Whereas*, The Congress of the United States granted him a
5 most unusual honor in nineteen hundred and sixty-three when
6 he was made an Honorary United States Citizen, which citizen-
7 ship was conferred upon him in absentia by President Kennedy
8 in April of that year; and

9 *Whereas*, The memory of this great statesman should be
10 perpetuated in the hearts and minds of the people of the free
11 world and particularly of the United States where he was held
12 in such high regard and esteem; therefore be it

13 *Resolved*, That the Massachusetts House of Representatives
14 respectfully requests that the Congress of the United States
15 draft appropriate resolutions of condolences in memory of Sir
16 Winston Churchill; and be it further

17 *Resolved*, That copies of these resolutions be sent forthwith
18 by the Secretary of the Commonwealth to the presiding officer
19 of each branch of Congress and to each member thereof from
20 this Commonwealth.
