The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Five.

AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE OFFICE OF INSPECTOR OF PLUMBING IN
THE CITY OF BROCKTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any statutory provisions to the
2 contrary, the mayor and city council of the city of Brockton
3 shall within sixty days after the acceptance of this act as herein-
4 after provided appoint from the classified civil service list an
5 inspector of plumbing who shall be a practical plumber and
6 shall have had practical experience either as a master plumber
7 or a journeyman plumber, continuously, during five years next
8 preceding his appointment. Said mayor and city council may
9 remove him subject to chapter thirty-one and shall fix his com-
10 pensation. Said inspector of plumbing shall inspect all plumb-
11 ing in process of construction, alteration or repair for which
12 permits are granted within the city, and shall report to the
13 mayor and city council violations of any law, ordinance, rule or
14 regulation relative to plumbing; and shall perform such other
15 appropriate duties as may be required; provided, however,
16 that the present incumbent in the office of the inspector of
17 plumbing shall continue to hold office and shall otherwise be
18 subject to the provisions hereinabove mentioned.

19 All provisions of the city ordinances inconsistent with the
20 provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take full effect upon its acceptance
2 by vote of the city council of the city of Brockton, subject to
3 the provisions of its charter, but not otherwise.
