

HOUSE No. 3561

By Messrs. Rourke of Lowell and Kiernan of Lowell, petition of John Janas, Cornelius F. Kiernan, John J. Desmond, Paul J. Sheehy, Raymond F. Rourke and John E. Harrington, Jr. (with the approval of the city manager and city council) that the city of Lowell be authorized to borrow money for the repair and reconstruction of the Textile Memorial Bridge and Pawtucket Bridge in said city. AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE REPAIR AND RECONSTRUCTION OF THE TEXTILE MEMORIAL BRIDGE AND PAWTUCKET BRIDGE IN THE CITY OF LOWELL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. For the purpose of repairing and reconstructing
2 the Textile Memorial Bridge and the Pawtucket Bridge, the
3 city of Lowell may borrow such sums as may be necessary and
4 may issue bonds or notes therefor which shall bear on the face
5 the words: — in relation to the Textile Memorial Bridge, “Lowell
6 Textile Memorial Bridge Repair Loan Act of 1965”; and in
7 relation to the Pawtucket Bridge, “Lowell Pawtucket Bridge
8 Repair Loan Act of 1965”. Each authorized issue shall consti-
9 tute a separate loan and such loans shall be paid in not more
10 than ten years from their dates. Indebtedness incurred under
11 this act shall be outside the statutory limit, and shall be author-
12 ized by a two-thirds vote of the city council; and shall, except as
13 provided herein, be subject to all other provisions under chap-
14 ter forty-four of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
