AN ACT TO INCREASE MINIMUM WAGES TO PEOPLE WHO REGULARLY RECEIVE GRATUITIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The second paragraph of section 7 of chapter 151
2 of the General Laws, as most recently amended by section 2 of
3 chapter 644 of the acts of 1964, is hereby further amended by
4 striking out, in line 6, the word "eighty-five" and inserting in
5 place thereof the word: — ninety.

1 SECTION 2. Said second paragraph of said section 7 of said
2 chapter 151, as amended by section 1 of this act, is hereby further
3 amended by striking out the word "ninety" and inserting in
4 place thereof the word: — ninety-three.

1 SECTION 3. Section one of this act shall take effect on Sep-
2 tember fifth, nineteen hundred and sixty-six.

1 SECTION 4. Section two of this act shall take effect on Sep-
2 tember fifth, nineteen hundred and sixty-seven.
