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HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, April 20, 1965.

The committee on Pensions and Old Age Assistance, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1014) of the Massachusetts State Council No. 41 AFSC&ME, AFL:CIO relative to the retirement of public employees whose regular duties require the care and supervision of epileptic and mentally deficient persons and youthful offenders; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1175) of the Massachusetts State Employees Association and George H. O'Farrell that certain employees of the Youth Service Board be classified in Group 2 under the contributory retirement law; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1176) of Samuel Harmon for legislation to classify certain employees of the Youth Service Board in Group 2 under the contributory retirement law; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1380) of the Massachusetts State Employees Association that certain employees of the Department of Mental Health be classified in Group 2 under the contributory retirement law, report the accompanying resolve (House, No. 3772).

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Five.

RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY THE RETIREMENT LAW COMMISSION RELATIVE TO CERTAIN RETIREMENT LAWS.

1 *Resolved*, That the retirement law commission is hereby  
2 authorized and directed to make an investigation and study  
3 of the subject matter of current house documents numbered  
4 1014, relative to the retirement of public employees whose  
5 regular duties require the care and supervision of epileptic  
6 and mentally deficient persons and youthful offenders; 1175,  
7 providing that certain employees of the youth service board be  
8 classified in Group 2 under the contributory retirement law;  
9 1176, providing that certain employees of the youth service  
10 board be classified in Group 2 under the contributory retire-  
11 ment law; and 1380, relative to providing that certain em-  
12 ployees of the department of mental health be classified in  
13 Group 2 under the contributory retirement law. Said com-  
14 mission shall report to the general court the results of its in-  
15 vestigation and study, and its recommendations, if any, to-  
16 gether with drafts of legislation necessary to carry said  
17 recommendations into effect by filing the same with the clerk  
18 of the house of representatives on or before the last Wednesday  
19 of January, nineteen hundred and sixty-six.
