## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Five.

AN ACT EXCLUDING THE SALE OF GASOLINE TO ALL VEHICLES REGISTERED AS COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLES FROM THE FAIR TRADE ACT.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 14A of chapter 93 of the General Laws is hereby  
2 amended by adding after clause (3) the following clause: —

3 (4) In the sale of gasoline at service stations from branded  
4 pumps or dispensers to: (a) all vehicles registered as commercial  
5 motor vehicles by the commonwealth or any other state and  
6 (b) all motor vehicles used in the transportation of passengers  
7 for hire. For the purposes of this clause “commercial motor  
8 vehicle” shall mean a vehicle as defined in section two of chap-  
9 ter one hundred and fifty-nine B.
