Substituted by the House, on motion of Mr. Mahan of Leominster, for a Bill requiring the photograph of a licensee to be part of the license form to operate motor vehicles (printed as Senate, No. 229). May 11.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Five.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT A LICENSE TO OPERATE A MOTOR VEHICLE SHALL CONTAIN A PHOTOGRAPH OF THE OPERATOR AND EXTENDING THE PERIOD FOR WHICH SUCH LICENSE SHALL BE VALID.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 8 of chapter 90 of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by striking out the sixth sentence, as appearing
3 in chapter 307 of the acts of 1958, and inserting in place thereof
4 the following sentence:— They shall contain a photograph of
5 the licensee, the distinguishing number or mark assigned to the
6 licensee, his name, his place of residence and address, a brief
7 description of him for purposes of identification, and such other
8 information as the registrar shall deem necessary.

1 SECTION 2. Said section 8 of said chapter 90 is hereby further
2 amended by striking out the ninth, tenth and eleventh sentences,
3 as so appearing, and inserting in place thereof the following sen-
4 tence:— A license or any renewal thereof issued to an operator
5 shall expire on an anniversary of the operator's date of birth
6 occurring more than twelve months but not more than forty-
7 eight months after the effective date of such license.

1 SECTION 3. The provisions of this act shall take effect one
2 year after its passage.

The Constitution of the United States

As amended by the Thirteenth, Fourteenth, Fifteenth, and Sixteenth Amendments

Article I. Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People in each State, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Representatives and direct Taxes shall be apportioned among the several States which may be admitted into or excluded from this Union, according to their respective Numbers, which shall be determined by adding to the whole Number of free Persons, including all bound Persons for Service, and all free Persons held as Servants in Foreign Countries, three fifths of all other Persons. The actual Enumeration shall be made within three Years after the first Meeting of the Congress of the United States, and in every subsequent Year, and such Enumeration shall be made in such Manner as they may direct. The Number of Representatives shall not exceed one for every thirty Thousand Persons, but each State shall have at least one Representative, and until such Time as they may have become entitled to a Representative, the Electors in such State shall have the Qualification requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.
