By Messrs. Berry of Peabody and O'Farrell of Malden, petition of the Disabled American Veterans, Dept. of Massachusetts, for legislation to authorize the issuance of distinctive motor vehicle registration plates to veterans receiving a statutory award from the Veterans Administration. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF CERTAIN NUMBER PLATES FOR VETERANS RECEIVING A STATUTORY AWARD FROM THE VETERANS ADMINISTRATION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The seventh paragraph of section 2 of chapter 90 of the
2 General Laws, as most recently amended by chapter 442 of
3 the acts of 1961, is hereby further amended by adding in the
4 first sentence thereof, after the words "or loss or permanent
5 loss of use of one or both hands:" the following words: — or
6 are receiving a statutory award from the Veterans Administra-
7 tion for the loss of sight of one eye; .

The Constitution of the State

Article I

Section 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

1. The Senate shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for six Years; and each Senator shall have one Vote.
2. Immediately after they shall be assembled in Consequence of the Election, they shall meet at the City of New York, until another Meeting be appointed by the Legislature.
3. The Senate shall have the sole and exclusive Power of confirming all Appointments, and of granting Pardons, in Cases of Impeachment.
4. The Senate shall have the sole and exclusive Power of trying all Impeachments, when the House of Representatives shall have impeached; and no Person shall be tried without the Consent of the Senate.
5. For all Treasons, Felonies, and other Crimes, the Senate shall have the sole and exclusive Power of Judgment; and no Person shall be convicted without the Concurrence of two thirds of the Members present.
6. Judgment in Cases of Impeachment shall not extend further than to removal from Office, and disqualification for the same; but no other Penalties shall be inflicted.
7. The House of Representatives shall have the sole and exclusive Power of Impeachment.
