## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Six.

AN ACT REQUIRING MANUFACTURERS OF MOTOR VEHICLES MANUFACTURED AFTER JANUARY 1, 1968 TO PROVIDE BREAK UP FACILITIES FOR JUNK CARS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 (a) Effective January one, nineteen hundred and sixty
- 2 eight no motor vehicle manufactured after said date shall be
- 3 sold or registered within the Commonwealth unless the manu-
- 4 facturer shall have established, or arranged for, break up and
- 5 disposal facilities, including transportation, for discarded,
- 6 junked, or unuseable motor vehicles. Said facilities and ar-
- 7 rangements shall be in accordance with regulations promul-
- 8 gated by the registrar of motor vehicles.
- 9 (b) The superior court in equity shall have jurisdiction
- 10 to enforce this act.

**The Commission of Investigation**

It is the duty of the Commission to examine the evidence and to report thereon to the House of Representatives.

1. (a) The Commission shall have the right to subpoena and to examine any person who may have information concerning the subject of the investigation.

2. (b) The Commission shall have the right to examine any document or paper which may be in the possession, custody or control of any person who may have information concerning the subject of the investigation.

3. (c) The Commission shall have the right to examine any record or book which may be in the possession, custody or control of any person who may have information concerning the subject of the investigation.

4. (d) The Commission shall have the right to examine any other evidence which may be available to it.

5. (e) The Commission shall have the right to examine any other evidence which may be available to it.
