AN ACT PERMITTING THE OPERATION OF COIN-OPERATED SELF-SERVICE LAUNDRIES AFTER ONE O'CLOCK IN THE AFTERNOON ON SUNDAYS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 6 of chapter 136 of the General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended by adding the following clause:—
- 3 (45). The operation of coin-operated self-service laundries
- 4 after one o'clock in the afternoon.

The Constitution of the United States

Article I, Section 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.
