The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Six.

AN ACT TO REQUIRE GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANIES TO FILE WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC UTILITIES A SCHEDULE OF ANY INCENTIVE OFFERED BY THEM TO OBTAIN BUSINESS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 164 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by inserting after section 127 the following section:—
3 *Section 128.* No gas or electric company shall offer or pay
4 any compensation or consideration or furnish any equipment
5 to secure the installation or adoption of the use of any gas or
6 electric services unless a schedule of such compensation, con-
7 sideration or equipment to be furnished is filed with the de-
8 partment and approved thereby, nor unless such company
9 offers such compensation, consideration or equipment to all
10 persons within the same classification using or applying for
11 such service;

1 SECTION 2. The provisions of section one hundred and
2 twenty-eight of chapter one hundred and sixty-four of the
3 General Laws, inserted by section one of this act, shall not
4 prohibit a gas or electric company, as defined in section one of
5 said chapter one hundred and sixty-four, from carrying out any
6 contractual commitment for gas or electric service in existence
7 prior to the effective date of this act.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

Chapter 154C, Section 1

Section 1. Chapter 154C, Section 1 of the General Laws, as amended, shall be amended to read as follows:

Section 1. The board shall have the honor and duty of representing the people of the Commonwealth, and by the exercise of its powers shall

1. preserve the integrity of the judicial branch of the Commonwealth;
2. advise the Governor on matters relating to the administration of the courts;
3. advise the Governor on matters relating to the appointment, promotion, discipline and removal of judges and judicial officers;
