AN ACT MAKING AVAILABLE POLICE AND INVESTIGATIVE SERVICES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 12 of the General Laws is hereby amended by insert-
2 ing after section 2A the following section: —
3 *Section 2B. Police and Investigative Services — Availability.*
4 The attorney general may request police and investigative per-
5 sonnel or services from any of the law enforcement agencies
6 within and of the Commonwealth or of any commission, agency,
7 department or political sub-division thereof including, but not
8 limited to, town, city, county, metropolitan district commis-
9 sion and department of public safety personnel and services.
10 The commissioner of public safety for the commonwealth, the
11 chairman of the metropolitan district commission, the commis-
12 sioner of police of the city of Boston and the officer in command
13 of the police departments of counties, cities and towns shall,
14 upon written request of the attorney general, detail on tempo-
15 rary duty with the department of the attorney general for police
16 and investigative services under the direction of the attorney
17 general those police officers and detectives of whatever rank that
18 are so requested by the attorney general. Such police officers or
19 detectives shall receive no extra compensation for services on
20 temporary duty with the department of the attorney general
21 and they shall be subject to the rules and regulations of the
