AN ACT REGULATING DEAD END CORRIDORS IN CERTAIN BUILDINGS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 21 of chapter 143 of the General Laws, as amended,
2 is hereby further amended by inserting after the second sen-
3 tence the following sentence: — If there is only one means of
4 egress from a corridor or part of a corridor which is the sole
5 means of egress from part of a building subject to this section,
6 such corridor or part of a corridor shall be separated from all
7 other corridors by fire resistive construction having at least a
8 one-hour rating, with all openings in such construction fitted
9 with a door or doors of like material.
