AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE CANCELLATION FOR NON-PAYMENT OF MOTOR
VEHICLE INSURANCE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Paragraph 2 of section 113A of chapter 175 of the General
2 Laws, as most recently amended by section 2 of chapter 568 of
3 the acts of 1961, is hereby further amended by adding at the end
4 the following sentence:— That motor vehicle insurance paid
5 by installments shall not be cancelled for non-payment if the
6 insured before such cancellation makes or tenders full payment
7 of amount due and owing.

The Constitution of the United States

As amended by the Thirteenth, Fourteenth, Fifteenth, and Nineteenth Amendments.

AS AUTHORIZED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, IN RESOLUTION PASSED MAY 15, 1894.

It is ordered by the House of Representatives, that the Constitution of the United States, as amended by the Thirteenth, Fourteenth, Fifteenth, and Nineteenth Amendments, be printed in the following form, and that the same be distributed to the members of the House of Representatives.

1. The original of the Constitution of the United States, as amended by the Thirteenth, Fourteenth, Fifteenth, and Nineteenth Amendments, shall be deposited in the Library of Congress.
2. The original of the Constitution of the United States, as amended by the Thirteenth, Fourteenth, Fifteenth, and Nineteenth Amendments, shall be deposited in the Library of the House of Representatives.
3. The original of the Constitution of the United States, as amended by the Thirteenth, Fourteenth, Fifteenth, and Nineteenth Amendments, shall be deposited in the Library of the Senate.
4. The original of the Constitution of the United States, as amended by the Thirteenth, Fourteenth, Fifteenth, and Nineteenth Amendments, shall be deposited in the Library of the Supreme Court.
5. The original of the Constitution of the United States, as amended by the Thirteenth, Fourteenth, Fifteenth, and Nineteenth Amendments, shall be deposited in the Library of the National Archives.
