## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Six.

### AN ACT RELATING TO THE PUBLICATION OF NOTICES OF PUBLIC HEARINGS IN ZONING MATTERS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 6 of chapter 40A of the General Laws is hereby  
2 amended by adding at the end the following:— If notice of  
3 public hearings by the planning board, city council, or board  
4 of selectmen, required as aforesaid, shall exceed in length eight  
5 pages, about 6 inches by 9 inches in size, or ordinary book print,  
6 the same may be published by the planning board, city coun-  
7 cil, or board of selectmen, respectively, in a municipal bulle-  
8 tin or printed pamphlet, a copy of which shall be filed with the  
9 city or town clerk who shall thereupon post a copy in the city  
10 or town hall and furnish copies to all persons who request the  
11 same, without cost. No newspaper publication shall be re-  
12 quired except that notice of the time, place and title of the sub-  
13 ject matter of said public hearing, and that copies of the entire  
14 subject matter are available, shall be published in a newspaper  
15 of general circulation in the city or town.
