## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AN ACT INCREASING THE SIZE AND SCOPE OF THE COMMISSION ON AGING BY ESTABLISHING TWO ADDITIONAL BUREAUS WITHIN.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 73 of chapter 6 of the General Laws, as most re-  
2 cently amended by section 2 of chapter 430 of the acts of 1964,  
3 is hereby further amended by adding at the end the following  
4 paragraph:—

5 There shall be established within said commission two bu-  
6 reaus, one for the purpose of administration, and one for pub-  
7 lic information and education, whose purpose shall be to co-  
8 ordinate the administrative and public educational functions  
9 of said agency with relation to existing state and federal pro-  
10 grams. Said bureaus shall be directed by assistants to the  
11 executive secretary at a salary to be determined by the com-  
12 mission.

The Commission of Enquiry

and the Commission of Enquiry

1. The Commission of Enquiry shall be appointed by the House of Representatives.
2. The Commission of Enquiry shall consist of not more than five members.
3. The Commission of Enquiry shall be appointed for a period of not more than six months.
4. The Commission of Enquiry shall have the right to call for and examine any documents or papers in the possession or control of any person.
5. The Commission of Enquiry shall have the right to require any person to attend before it and to give evidence.
6. The Commission of Enquiry shall have the right to require any person to produce any documents or papers in his possession or control.
7. The Commission of Enquiry shall have the right to require any person to answer any questions put to him.
8. The Commission of Enquiry shall have the right to require any person to give evidence on oath.
9. The Commission of Enquiry shall have the right to require any person to give evidence in writing.
10. The Commission of Enquiry shall have the right to require any person to give evidence in public.
11. The Commission of Enquiry shall have the right to require any person to give evidence in private.
12. The Commission of Enquiry shall have the right to require any person to give evidence in any other manner.
