RESOLVE FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A COMMISSION TO STUDY
ESCHEAT LEGISLATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF OBTAINING REVENUE
FROM THE GIVING OF TRADING STAMPS.

1 *Resolved*, That a commission shall be appointed consisting
2 of two members of the house of representatives, two members of
3 the senate, two members of the public and one representative
4 from the office of the attorney general to study escheat legis-
5 lation for the purpose of obtaining revenue from the giving of
6 trading stamps and make a report thereon to the legislature on
7 or before November first, nineteen hundred and sixty-six.
