AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS TO ERECT
A BARRIER ON THE MEDIAN OF ROUTE 128.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:*

- 1 The department of public works is hereby authorized and
- 2 directed to erect a barrier on the median of Route 128 in order
- 3 to prevent vehicles from crossing said median into oncoming
- 4 traffic. For said purpose said department may expend such
- 5 sums as may be appropriated therefor.

The Constitution of the State

Article I

Section 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2
