AN ACT PROHIBITING THE PAYMENT OF STATE AID TO CITIES, TOWNS AND REGIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICTS FOR MAINTENANCE OF VOCATIONAL SCHOOLS UNLESS CERTAIN EDUCABLE MENTALLY RETARDED PUPILS ARE ELIGIBLE FOR ADMISSION TO SAID SCHOOLS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 9 of chapter 74 of the General Laws, as most recently
2 amended by section 6 of chapter 599 of the acts of 1957, is here-
3 by further amended by adding at the end the following:—
4 ; provided, however, that no payment shall be made under this
5 section unless special class children sixteen years of age or over,
6 who are educable under the provisions of section forty-six of
7 chapter seventy-one and who meet the requirements for the
8 completion of the sixth grade, are eligible for admission to any
9 of the aforesaid schools.
