RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE UNDERWRITING POLICIES OF COMPANIES WRITING FIRE INSURANCE IN THE COMMONWEALTH AND RELATIVE TO THE POSSIBILITY OF EXTENDING THE VOLUNTARY FIRE INSURANCE INSPECTION PLAN NOW INDEPENDENTLY OPERATED BY THE SAID COMPANIES.

1 *Resolved*, That a special commission to consist of three
2 members of the senate, five members of the house of represen-
3 tatives and two persons to be appointed by the governor, is
4 hereby established for the purpose of making an investigation
5 and study of present underwriting policies of companies writ-
6 ing fire insurance in the commonwealth, with a view towards
7 examining the difficulties encountered by apartment owners
8 and commercial businesses in obtaining adequate fire, theft,
9 and casualty insurance and examining the possibility of ex-
10 tending the voluntary fire insurance inspection plan now in-
11 dependently operated by the companies.

THE PROVISIONS OF THE ACT

AS ENACTED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

ON JULY 1, 1911.

The following provisions of the Act shall have effect as if they were contained in a single section, to-wit: That the Secretary of the Interior be and he is authorized to issue such orders as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act.

That a certain amount of land in the State of California, to-wit: the land described in the schedule hereto, be and the same is hereby reserved for the use of the people of the State of California, and the same shall be held in trust for the people of the State of California, and the same shall be managed and disposed of for the benefit of the people of the State of California, and the proceeds of the sale of the same shall be used for the benefit of the people of the State of California.
