## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Six.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT CLASSIFICATIONS OF RISKS AND PREMIUM CHARGES UNDER THE COMPULSORY MOTOR VEHICLE LIABILITY INSURANCE LAW BE UNIFORM THROUGHOUT THE COMMONWEALTH.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The second paragraph of section 113B of chapter  
2 175 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the  
3 first sentence, as appearing in section 4 of chapter 459 of the  
4 acts of 1935, and inserting in place thereof the following sentence:  
5 — The commissioner shall annually on or before September  
6 fifteenth, after due hearing and investigation, fix and establish  
7 fair and reasonable classifications of risks, and adequate, just,  
8 reasonable and nondiscriminatory premium charges to be used  
9 and charged by companies in connection with the issue or execu-  
10 tion of motor vehicle liability policies or bonds, both as defined  
11 in section thirty-four A of chapter ninety, for the ensuing cal-  
12 endar year or any part thereof. But said classifications and  
13 premium charges shall be uniform throughout the commonwealth  
14 and shall not be fixed or established according to districts or  
15 zones.

1 SECTION 2. The state secretary shall cause to be placed on  
2 the official ballot to be used at the next biennial state election  
3 the following question:—“Do you approve of an act passed  
4 by the general court in the current year which provides that  
5 classification of risks and premium charges under the  
6 compulsory motor vehicle insurance law be uniform  
7 throughout the commonwealth?”

8 If a majority of votes cast in answer to said question is in the  
9 affirmative, this act shall take effect, but not otherwise.
