AN ACT TO REGULATE BARBER APPRENTICES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 871 of chapter 112 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by adding the following new paragraph to the end of
3 said section:—

4 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, a barber appren-
5 tice shall have a maximum period of twenty-four months in
6 which the barber apprentice shall apply to become a licensed
7 barber in the commonwealth of Massachusetts. If the appren-
8 tice shall fail in the full license examination, he shall re-apply
9 for said examination within six months' time and subsequently
10 every six months thereafter until he has successfully passed his
11 full license examination; failure on the part of the apprentice
12 to re-apply for said examination at the six month intervals
13 shall mean loss of his apprentice license.
