AN ACT LIMITING THE DURATION OF THE PAYMENT OF PREMIUMS ON LIFE INSURANCE POLICIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any provision of general or special law to the
2 contrary, all life insurance policies written in the commonwealth
3 shall contain a provision that when and if the owner of said policy
4 shall pay premiums which, in total, equal the face amount of
5 said policy, then the same shall be fully paid-up and no premiums
6 shall thereafter be due or payable.

AN ACT TO AMEND THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK IN RELATION TO THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL.

Section 1. The Constitution of the State of New York is amended by adding to article IV, section 1, the following:

1. The office of the attorney general shall be a civil office, and shall be held by a person who shall have been admitted to the practice of law in this state, and shall have resided in this state for at least five years immediately preceding his appointment to the office.
